One of our many goals this year is to make more philanthropic donations to the Paul Newman Hole in the Wall Gang Camps, as well as help out many of the other philanthropies on campus and in the community. This year, we are bringing back our philanthropy event, Absolute Pledge Class, a 3-day competition held on October 20-22 between the all the fraternities pledge classes. The event includes a dodgeball tournament, a 3-on-3 basketball tournament, a 3-pt shootout, the Battle for the Campus field games, and penny wars throughout the 3-days. Our goal is to raise \$2,000, the cost to send a terminally ill kid to a camp for one week, and with the support of local sponsors, the Greek community, and all the brothers and alumni we should meet this goal with ease.

HOUSE WORK

Preceding move-in day of the fall semester, a lot of work was done on 1203 W. 3rd. One of the biggest changes was that all of the lofts that were previously in a majority of the rooms were torn down, disposed of and replaced with brand new bunk beds that were assembled in-house by both undergraduates and alumni together. Along with the new bed frames, 29 mattresses were purchased to replace older ones that were no longer in an acceptable state. On top of bunk beds and mattresses a new fire alarm system was installed that has capabilities far beyond the old one. Repairs to the smoke deck were also generously done by the Corriveau family, All of the work done on the Phi Tau house this summer totaled at around \$20,000.
